
That leads us to who knows where ...

Vision Committee Report

With vestry approvals completed for both the design and the construction budget for renovations at our new church, we moved forward in concert with Trinity Centres Foundation preparing and delivering our application to the Huron Development Fund.

Since Veronica and I were invited to speak to the Grants and Loans Committee on March 21st., we prepared an eight minute presentation covering most of the significant events in our parish over the last six years. Additionally, we supported our application by pitching all the features and benefits of our low risk project. During the 45 minutes we were with the Committee, we were able to answer all their questions. They seemed pleased with the completeness of the application, all the work that went into it, and the professionalism of our presentation.

As part of the application, Archdeacon Osita Oluigbo submitted a very strong letter of support for our project. In it, he said he's been following our plans with excitement and cited our openness to different possibilities, the promptings of the Holy Spirit, and he commended our willingness to try something relatively new in the form of a storefront church. He believes the project is a win-win for the Diocese and for a continued Anglican presence and ministry in the Town of Ingersoll.

The Grants and Loans Committee recommendation will go to the Administration and Finance Committee this month and then to Diocesan Council in May for a final decision. We will share that decision with you as soon as possible after it is rendered.

In the meantime we'll continue to work with our consultants at Trinity Centres Foundation, PK Construction and our architect on finding efficiencies in the design and construction process of our project.

Selection Committee Report

The committee was active at the end of January as we made email contact with all the Canadian religious colleges and universities that educate Anglican priests. Our correspondence was as follows; we "personalized" it for each college / administrator that we reached out to -"St. James' Analican Church in Ingersoll Ontario is searching for a new priest. Our Selection Committee for the Parish has decided to be proactive and reach out to the principals and presidents of theological colleges and universities across the country in hopes that administrators like vourself would be willing to promote our search for a new permanent priest. We hope that you can make the attached information available to your professors and heads of department in the Religious Studies program.

In conversation with our Bishop of Huron, The Right Reverend Dr. Todd Townsend, and several of the Archdeacons in the Diocese of Huron - The Venerable Archdeacon Tanya Phibbs, The Venerable Stephen McClatchie, and, The Venerable Doctor Osita Oluigbo - we have been encouraged to actively promote our parish and our intentions of finding a new permanent priest. With a shortage of candidates within Huron, we are broadening our search across the province and country.

We sincerely hope that you might assist us in forwarding our Parish Profile information to those in your area that may be interested or know of someone who has recently graduated and is searching for a position. Any assistance that you can give us, is gratefully appreciated. Please do not hesitate to reach out to us if you have concerns and or questions.

Please find attached a cover letter as well as a poster of the Parish Profile. The QR code on it has been activated to our profile."

We received back several replies that assured our committee that the personnel at these institutions would assist us with our search. Sunday School News



Part Time Vacancies at St. James' Parish

Office Administrator -

We are looking to hire an office administrator for our parish this spring. Here's a few things about the part time job at St. James' Church Office that a person should know if considering applying.

#1 - 12 hours a week at \$17.90 an hour - our treasurer will pay the employee every two weeks by cheque

#2 - usually 4 hour time slots - 3 days a week – the employee can choose which days and which hours during the day from 9 am to 4 pm #3 - job duties - preparing weekly bulletins for church services; sending out emails to remind parishioners of various tasks (ex. who is reading on a Sunday and provide the person with a copy of the reading)

#4 - mailing out letters to pay bills; general correspondence

#5 - purchasing office supplies as needed
#6 - answering the phone - inquiries from companies, parishioners, townspeople
#7 - inputting donations into the database (we presently use a product called Verse which the newly hired person would get training on)
#8 - will be working under the guidance of our new permanent or interim priest to complete administrative tasks required by the priest

We would prefer to hire an applicant who is familiar with the Anglican Liturgy and is interested in being a part of our worshipping community.

The employee would get vacation pay and would not work statutory holidays. Holidays can be negotiated. The past admin people sometimes took two weeks all at one time while others used various days over the months. The employee would have a period of trial for three months and this would allow both the employee and the employer time to see if the working relationship is viable and acceptable to both parties.

Our office is called The Annex and is located at 231 Thames St. S in Ingersoll (beside First Baptist Church). When our construction is completed at 130 Thames St. S, the Office Administrator will work out of that location.

Custodian -

Similar to hiring an office administrator for our parish this spring, the Wardens are also looking to employ a new part time custodian. Here's a few things about this position that a person should know if considering applying for the job.

#1-5 hours (in total for work at both The Annex and The Masonic Hall) a week at \$16.25 an hour

#2 – light housekeeping duties at the parish office, The Annex including – vacuuming rugs, dusting, cleaning the bathroom, putting garbage out for weekly pick up, sweeping, etc.

#3 – preparing the Masonic Hall worship space for Sunday services –setting up furniture, sound system, 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM – one hour; and, putting furniture and other equipment away after the service – 12 - 1 PM, one hour

The employee would get vacation pay and would not work statutory holidays. Holidays can be negotiated. Two weeks holidays paid.

These jobs can be combined if an individual who is applying feels that they have the necessary job skills and time to fulfill the conditions of both part-time positions.

Please email one of the wardens – Veronica or Michael if you are interested in setting up an interview for either position. We will be advertising this position outside of the parish if we do not have any suitable interested candidates. This will be done at the beginning of May.

Please be prepared to submit references and a resume of past job experiences.

Primate Linda Nicholls announces her retirement

The Most Rev. Linda Nicholls, Archbishop and Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, informed the Church of her intention to retire in September this year.

"In the fall of 2024 I will complete thirty-nine years of ordained ministry in the Anglican Church of Canada. Although it had been my hope to continue until General Synod 2025, I will also reach our mandatory retirement age. I have therefore written to the Senior Metropolitan, Archbishop Anne Germond, to offer my resignation as of September 15, 2024", says Primate Nicholls in her letter issued on April 9. Archbishop Nicholls had served as a suffragan bishop of the Diocese of Toronto, and then as the diocesan bishop of the Diocese of Huron before she was elected Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada in 2019.

In her letter, she thanks for the privilege of serving our beloved church: "Thank you for your prayers, care and support through the good times and the difficult ones".

A message to the Anglican Church of Canada

In the fall of 2024 I will complete thirty-nine years of ordained ministry in the Anglican Church of Canada. Although it had been my hope to continue until General Synod 2025, I will also reach our mandatory retirement age. I have therefore written to the Senior Metropolitan, Archbishop Anne Germond, to offer my resignation as of September 15, 2024.

When I began ordained ministry I had no idea of the adventures and privilege that lay ahead of me serving as a deacon and priest in three parishes; in the national office in the Faith, Worship & ministry department; as a suffragan bishop in the Diocese of Toronto; as diocesan bishop of the Diocese of Huron and, in these past nearly five years, as Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada.

The greatest joy has been to share in the relationship between God and God's people through pastoral care, preaching, teaching and sacramental ministries and advocate for justice and compassion for all. To see God at work bringing healing and hope in the midst of the sorrows, pain and joy of daily life for individuals, families, communities and our wider world is a privilege that cannot be measured. I have also delighted in bringing the voice of the wider church – across Canada and the world – into parishes and dioceses through being present on Zoom or in person in travelling coast to coast.

Initially, after retirement, time for rest without the responsibilities of leadership will be welcome. Then I will enjoy walking with God's people, not as a leader, but as a friend, teacher and mentor alongside opportunities that allow my soul to sing – literally and figuratively.

Thank you for the privilege of serving our beloved church. Thank you for your prayers, care and support through the good times and the difficult ones.

May God grant us all courage to confess Jesus Christ as Lord and to proclaim with joy the good news of the Gospel wherever we may be! Thanks be to God, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!!
