The theme for this year's Diocesan Synod is from the Book of Micah. The agenda indicates that it will be as usual a very jam packed session. Monday's morning session will feature an address from our new Coadjutor Bishop, The Rt. Rev'd Linda Nicholls. Those of you who receive our diocesan newspaper, Huron Church News, may be familiar with her background. For those of you who are not, you will find a brief biography of Bishop Nicholls on page 2. She will be assuming Bishop Bennett's role in November as Bishop Bennett has recently announced his retirement. The following is an excerpt from the College of Deacons -

" These words from Christ are the basis for the College of Deacons outreach at Synod this year. In the past you have been generous in providing food for the hungry, hats, gloves, socks, and underclothes for those in need.

This year the focus will be on blankets. They will be given to shelters, and church outreach projects to provide warmth and comfort to the sick, homeless, and lonely.

"Project Linus" will onbe one of the recipients of the blankets. This organisation collects and distributes blankets to children and teenagers in all crisis situations: ie. hospitals, hospice, ambulance. If you are making blankets specifically for Project Linus, here are their guidelines : A) Most importantly the blankets MUST be free from fragrance such as fabric softeners (from prewashing the fabric), perfume, or cigarette smoke

B) All styles, sizes and shapes including quilts, fleece blankets, crocheted or knitted afghans and receiving blankets. All blankets must be new and washable. Please use only new fabric and sturdy acrylic yarns (not wool) for your blankets. Nothing is written in stone. The more important issue is that when blankets are being made for children that they are in child friendly colours and fabrics and sewn or knit well to withstand lots of use and washing.

All other blankets will be gratefully accepted and distributed to the areas of need. Thank you for your generosity, kindness and compassion.

If you would like to donate a blanket, please speak to Rev'd Meghan and it will be delivered to Synod.



**The Rt. Rev. Linda Nicholls**, area bishop of Trent-Durham, was elected coadjutor bishop of the Diocese of Huron at St. Paul's Cathedral in London, Ont. on Feb. 13. The diocese is located in the southwestern part of Ontario and has about 200 parishes.

Bishop Nicholls was elected among eight candidates as the first woman bishop in Huron after three ballots, acquiring a majority of the vote of both the laity and the clergy in Synod.

"I am delighted that people of Huron gathered in Synod have called the Rt. Rev. Linda Nicholls to the office of coadjutor bishop for the Diocese of Huron," said the Bishop of Huron, the Rt. Rev. Robert Bennett, upon announcing the results. "She is a gifted and faithful leader who will help chart our future to that place where God-in-Christ wills us to be. I very much look forward to working with her."

As coadjutor bishop, Bishop Nicholls will automatically become the 13<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Huron when Bishop Bennett retires.

Bishop Nicholls has been a suffragan bishop in the Diocese of Toronto since 2008, serving as the area bishop of Trent-Durham. Previous to that, she served in three parishes in the diocese and was the national church's co-ordinator of dialogue for Ethics, Interfaith Relations and Congregational Development. She is cochair of the Anglican-Roman Catholic Dialogue in Can.





**Bishop Bob Bennett** has indicated to Archbishop Colin Johnson his intention to retire as Bishop of Huron, effective November 1, 2016.

Bishop Bob was ordained a deacon on May 1, 1974, priested on May 8, 1975 and consecrated a bishop on September 14, 2002. On Oct. 25, 2008, he was elected the 12<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Huron. Bishop Bob has served the parishes of Trinity, Simcoe, St. John's, Woodhouse and Port Ryerse Memorial Church; Holy Trinity, Chesley, Christ Church, Tara and Church of the Ascension, Paisley; St. George's, Kitchener; St. Mark's, Brantford and All Saints', Windsor.

Bishop Bob has also been regional dean of Brant, a canon of the Cathedral Church of St. Paul. archdeacon of Brant-Norfolk and Oxford and archdeacon of Essex. He been a member of Provincial and General Synod, the Council of General Synod, the Provincial Executive, the Diocesan Council, the Diocesan Sub-Council, the Nominating Committee, the Deacons' Board, the Postulancy Board, the Safe Church Committee, the Sexual Assault Response Team, the Catechumenate Network, the Sesquicentennial Planning Group, the Implementation Task Force, the Human Resources Committee, the Pension Trustees, the Bishop's Clergy Conference Planning Committee, the Doctrine and Worship Committee, the Companion Diocese Committee, the Diocesan Executive Staff, the Committee on the Revision of Constitution and Canons, the Strategic Plan Implementation Group, the Bishop Luxton Memorial Scholarship Committee, the McConnell Trust Fund Committee, the Renew Committee, the Council of Advice, the Administration and Finance Committee and the Svnod Organizational Committee. He has been the Bishop to ACPO, a member of the Corporation of Renison University College and the Chair of the Huron University College Corporation.

A retirement celebration for Bishop Bob will be held in the fall.
