The group comprised of 25 women from around the world who helped me to understand the Anglican presence in countries such as Pakistan, Scotland, Australia, just to name a few. The stories that were shared were both heart breaking and hopeful as we listened to the reality to which each woman brought with her and together seek ways to empower each other and women and girls around the world.

This experience has certainly broadened my awareness of gender based issues and given me hope that we can make a difference. Together as children of God we can strive for a world where the dignity of every human being is respected. Over the next several months I will be making presentations and writing articles on this experience, so please stay tuned.

In the words of a friend and fellow Canadian delegate to the CSW Laura Marie Piotrowicz: "May we rise to the challenge. May we overcome our tiredness, our lethargy, our apathy. May we recognize that an injustice to any one of our society is a detriment to us all. May we live our baptismal vows to respect the dignity of all and to seek Christ in everyone - regardless of gender or race or language or nation. and still our burden was light.


I did not trust Him, at first, in control of my life.
